This following activity was created, by Freedom in Education, to accompany the *Heroes of Liberty Book*, Alexander Hamilton.

(You should have a map of the United States displayed to show children the places mentioned in the book. A copy of the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and a ten-dollar bill would also be helpful.)

1. Why do you think Alexander Hamilton's mother thought it was important to buy books for her two boys even though they didn't have much money? (pg. 7)
2. At age eleven, Alexander and his brother became orphans. What does the word "orphan" mean? (pg. 9)
3. What were Alexander Hamilton's most important tools and "sharpest weapons"? (pg. 13)
4. Who did we fight in the Revolutionary War? (pg. 18)
5. Why did the colonists dress up as Native Americans? (pg. 21)
6. George Washington should be a familiar name to you, but you might not have known he was a General. Why do you know who he is? (pg. 32)
7. On September 3, 1783, what was signed to end the war and establish peace between the American colonies and Britain? (pg. 38)
8. What document did Alexander Hamilton help draft that protects the freedom of Americans? (pg. 43)
9. Does anyone know what a duel is? (pg. 46)
10. What is one thing you learned about Alexander Hamilton or our country from this book?

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
